Context for SBIR/STTR in Massachusetts

- Massachusetts has one of the most concentrated innovation economies in the world (25% of state's employment is in the innovation economy)
- Massachusetts' success is rooted in innovation and entrepreneurship
- State policy focuses on providing a fertile environment for success, leveraging federal funding, encouraging productive partnerships, and letting success be determined by the marketplace


Context for SBIR/STTR in Massachusetts (cont)

- Massachusetts is one of the most successful participants in the SBIR and STTR programs
 - 2nd in absolute terms (dollars, # awards) to CA
 - First in relative (per capita) terms among our peer LTS (double the rate of nearest competitor, 4X rate of CA)
 - Total awards in FY 2002 to MA
 - SBIR \$215 MM 799 awards
 - STTR \$10 MM 76 awards

Context for SBIR/STTR in Massachusetts (cont)

- Participation in SBIR and STTR is very broad based – literally hundreds of companies, thousands of projects
- Massachusetts is home to some of the most successful participating companies in SBIR and STTR programs
- Typically 25% of Phase I awards in MA are made to startups and other companies who are new to government contracting
- SBIR and STTR programs are viewed as an important asset to be leveraged for technology based economic development throughout MA

Cluster-based


 Work with cluster-based organizations that provide access and support to companies in key sectors of the innovation economy
