2. STATISTICS FOR CHILDREN BY TIME (Children >= 24 Months Of Age)

Of children who received their first vaccine by 3 months of age (excluding hospital-given Hepatitis B), 0.00% (0/97) received the WFP4:Polio3:Hib1:Hib2:Hib3 vaccine by 24 months of age.

Of children who received their first vaccine after 3 months of age (excluding hospital-given Hepatitis B), 0.00% (0/0) received the WFP4:Polio3:Hib1:Hib2:Hib3 vaccine by 24 months of age.

Thus, children in this practice who received their first immunization by 3 months of age are approx. ~~times~~ times more likely to have completed the 4:3:1:0:0 vaccine by 24 months of age than kids who started after 3 months.

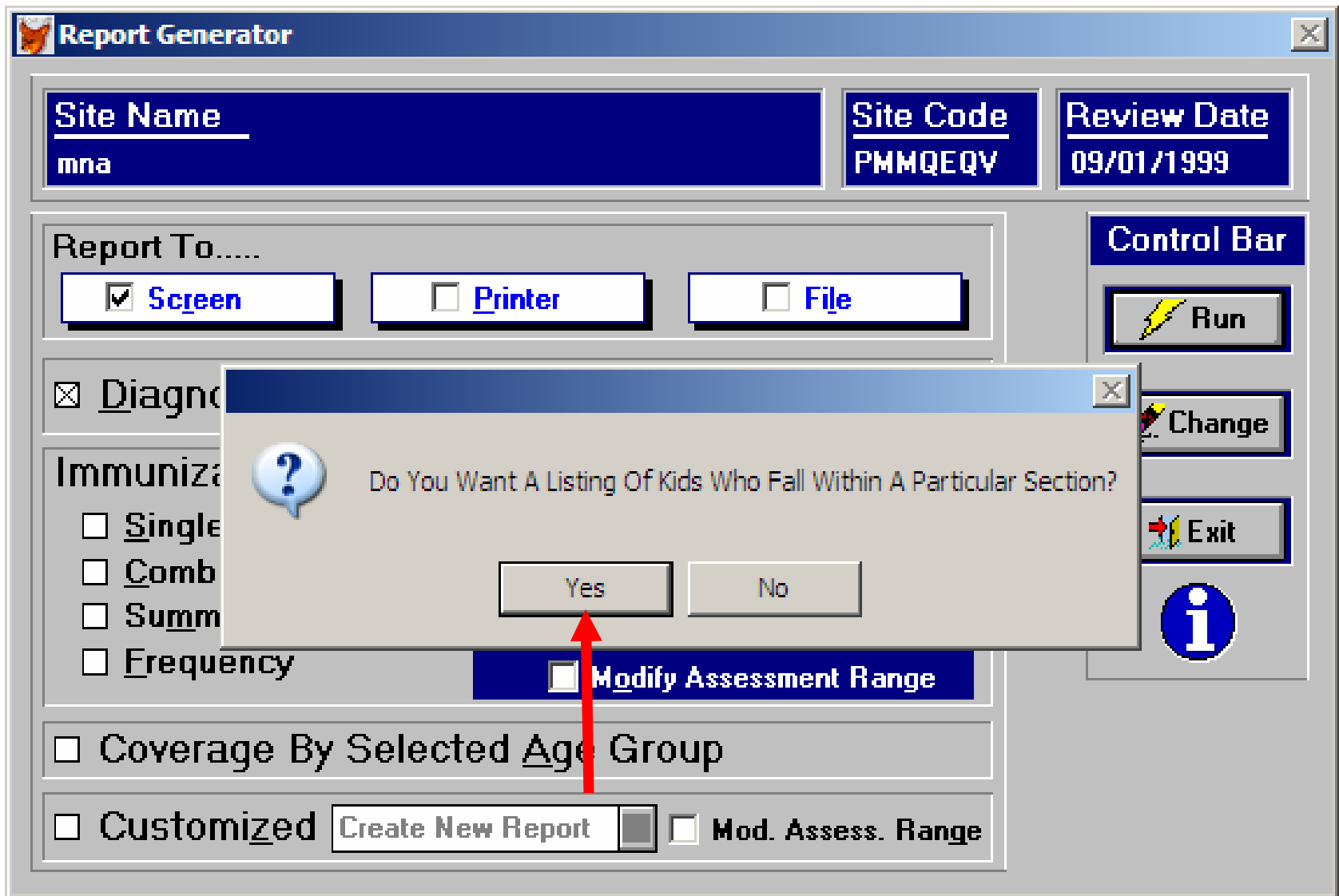
Comment: Children who begin the vaccine after 3 months of age are at increased risk of not completing the vaccine on time. Post-partum appointments for vaccination may help ensure that all children start on time.

- ◆ At the prompt, click “Yes” to get a list of children in each section of the report

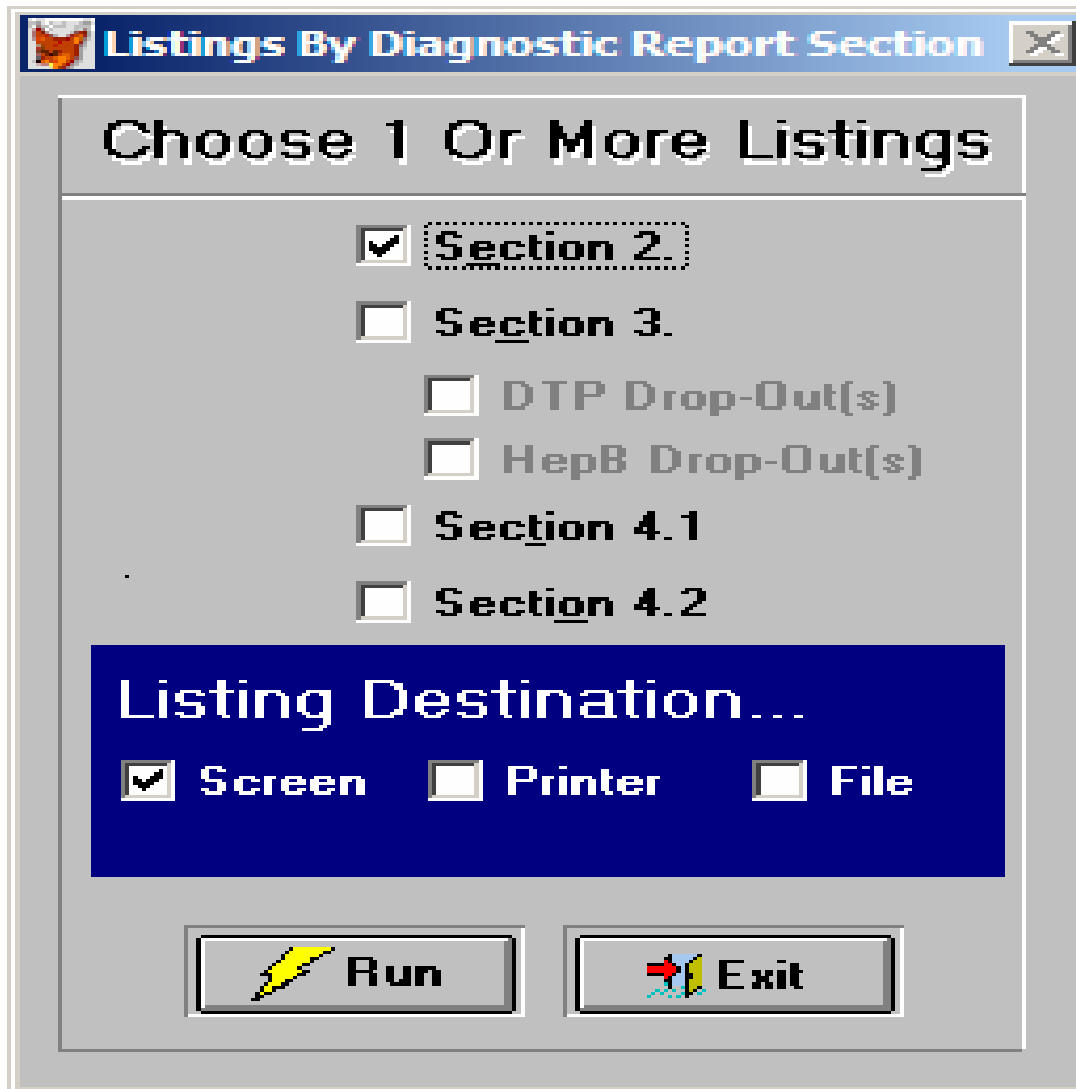

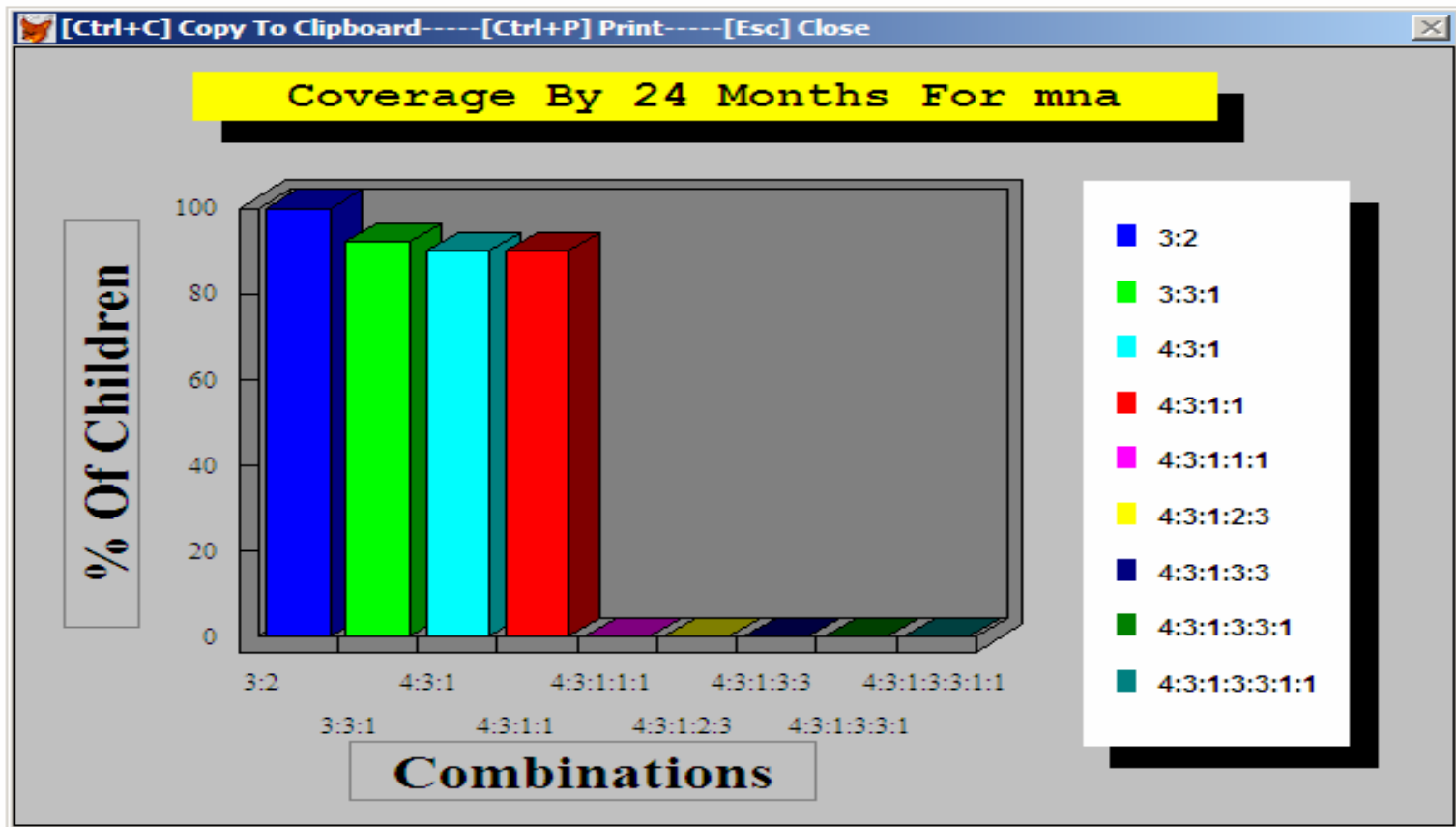

- ◆ Using this menu, you can double-click on any clinic dataset on the left to move it to the right window for comparative analyses

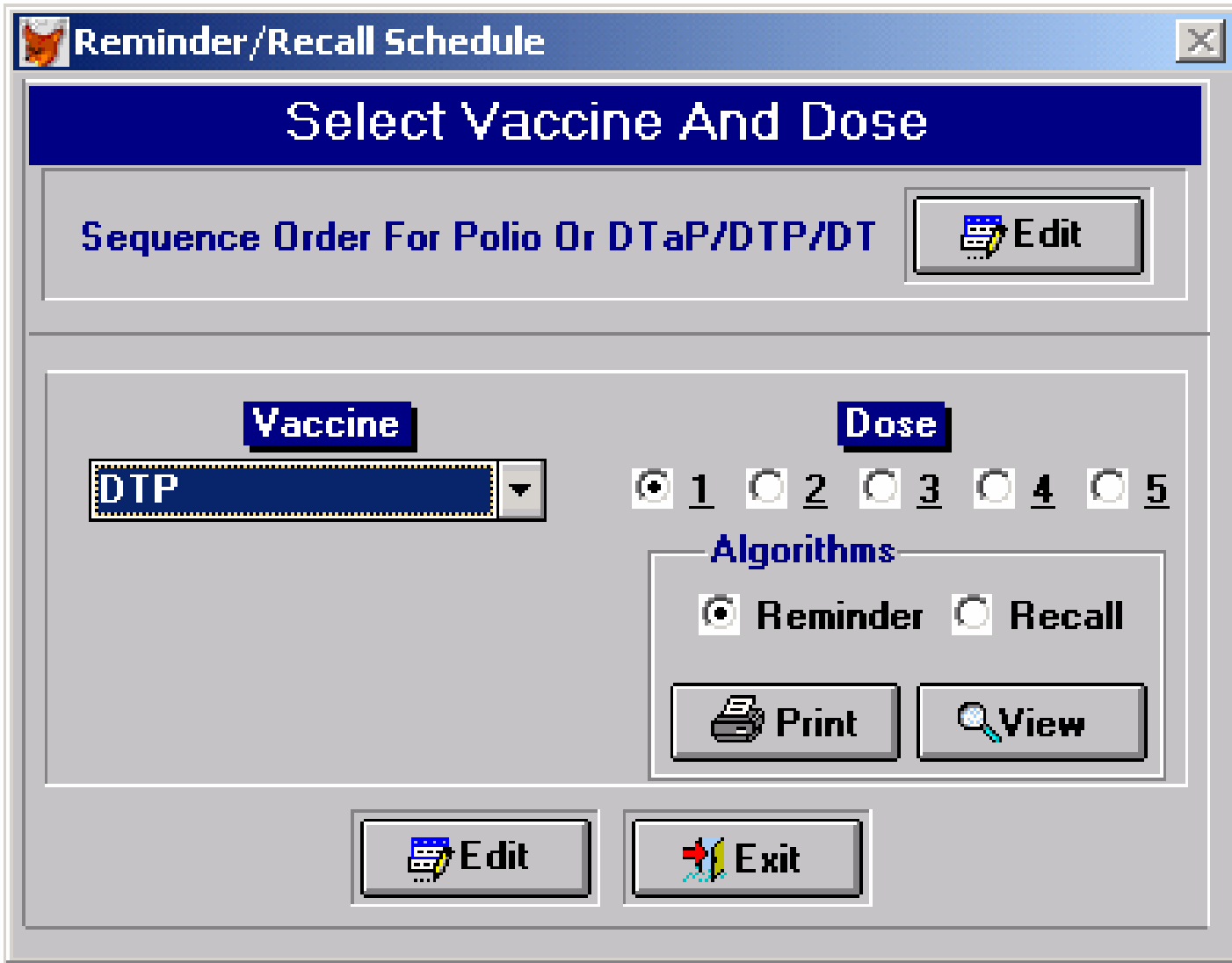
Cross Tabulations

- ◆ Use the Quick Count Report tool to cross-tabulate risk factor and antigen combinations to see which risk categories, if any, are better immunized
- ◆ Use the Graph facility to better visualize results
- ◆ Using the By Year of Birth menu, the analyses can be repeated for annual birth cohorts

Reminders and Recalls

- ◆ Click on Follow-Up | Reminder | Recall Schedules
- ◆ Click on Sequence Order and make sure the settings match the clinic protocols: OPV and DTP
- ◆ Exit from this menu and return to main page

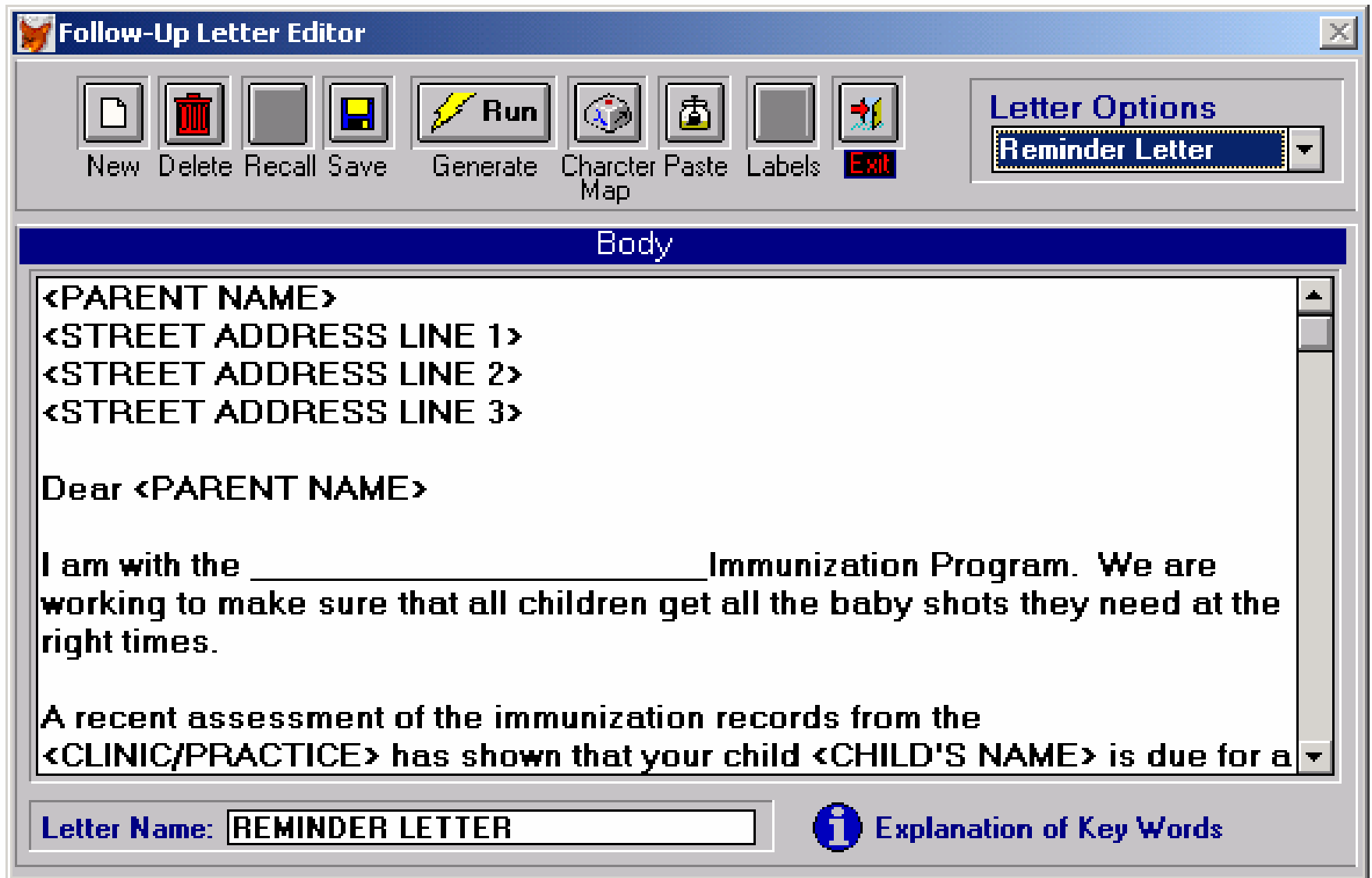

Reminders and Recalls

- ◆ Again enter Follow-up, click on Letters, and select Reminder Letters
- ◆ This will open up a form letter to remind parents to bring children for their next shots

Reminders and Recalls

- ◆ Click Run and another dialog box opens
- ◆ Choose "Yes" to using the same clinic's data
- ◆ For letter type, click Past Due (Recall)
- ◆ Also check List Names and Shots
- ◆ Click OK

- ◆ Click Next to see the second letter, and so on
